

Middle School Clinician Craig Westwood

Mr. Craig Westwood is in his 11th year as Director of Bands at Cherry Creek West Middle School. Prior to taking the position at West, Mr. Westwood was Director of Bands at Wheat Ridge High School for 9 years. He holds an Undergraduate degree in Music Education from Colorado Christian University and a Masters Degree in Conducting from The American Band College at Southern Oregon University. Mr. Westwood is an active clinician/adjudicator in Concert, Jazz and Marching Band in Colorado. The past four summers he has been a guest conductor at the Lebanese Band Association for the Promotion of Music (LeBAM) International Band Camp held near Beirut, Lebanon. He is a member of the Colorado Bandmasters Association and Phi Beta Mu and is an active performer in the Denver/Boulder area as a Percussionist, primarily playing drumset. Craig has performed with a variety of artists including Bo Diddley, "Pinetop" Perkins, Big Bill Morganfield, Don Lanphere, and The Boulder Philharmonic. A native of Colorado, Mr. Westwood grew up in Littleton and graduated from Columbine High School. He now lives in the Chatfield area with his wife Marcee, daughter Emma (18), and son Ridge (7).

John Gunther is a composer and multi-instrumentalist playing Saxophones, Clarinet, and Flute. With a restless musical spirit, he explores all forms of jazz from traditional to avant-garde as well as classical, world and experimental electronic music. He has performed on stages throughout the U.S., South America and Europe, in Carnegie Hall, in the middle of the ocean, and on the back of a truck. In addition to leading his own groups, he has performed with Christian McBride, The Maria Schneider Orchestra, the Carpe Diem String Quartet, and the Paris Sinfonietta Chamber Orchestra.

John is an Associate Professor and Director of the Thompson Jazz Studies Program and received his PH.D. from NYU. In 2007 he founded the Boulder Laptop Orchestra (BLOrk) to explore the intersection of music, art, and technology. BLOrk has let to further collaboration with the STEM program at CU exploring informal science education through the arts.

John is married to Stephanie Texera who teaches instrumental music at Skyline HS and has two awesome boys attending Fairview HS. When not listening, thinking, teaching or talking about music, they dig in the dirt in their backyard and plant things.

Travis Keller is in his 16th year of teaching and has been the director of bands at Fairview High School in Boulder, CO for twelve years. He holds a Bachelor's degree from the University of Colorado at Boulder in Music Education and a Master of Music Degree from Colorado State University with an emphasis in conducting. He has been a conductor and clinician around the state of Colorado since the year 2000 and his bands have performed and competed around the state and the country. The Fairview High School bands have been invited to perform at the Colorado Music Educator's Clinic/Conference, received continuous invitations to the Colorado Bandmasters State Concert Band Festival and the Fairview marching band has been a 20 year finalist, including being a top 3 medalist band for the last six straight years. The award winning Fairview High School jazz program currently has three big bands and five jazz combos. When he is not at work, Travis likes to hike, camp, play golf and spend time with his wife Cathy and his two kids, Matthew (6) and Emma (3).

Genice Matzke is the Director of Bands at Liberty High School in Colorado Springs, CO. Mrs. Matzke earned a Bachelor of Music Education degree from the University of Missouri and a Master's of Music Education degree from the University of Northern Colorado (UNC) where she was a graduate teaching assistant in the Music Education Department.

As an educator Mrs. Matzke has taught in St. Louis, MO as well as Salida, Grand Junction, Monument, and Colorado Springs, CO. While at Grand Junction High School her bands received consistent Superior ratings and her Jazz Ensemble I performed twice at the Colorado Music Educator Clinic/Conference as well as the Essentially Ellington Workshop in Snowmass, CO. In 2001, Mrs. Matzke was named the "Outstanding Teacher of the Year" by the Grand Junction Chamber of Commerce.

Mrs. Matzke's bands continued to thrive at Creekside Middle School in the Lewis-Palmer School District. In 2003, her eighth grade jazz band performed at the Colorado Music Educator's Clinic/Conference as did the 8th grade Symphonic Band in 2005.

In the nine years that Mrs. Matzke has been at Liberty High the marching band has gone from 21st to 1st place at state and the concert and jazz bands have consistently received Superior ratings at various festivals and contests. In 2012 and 2016, the Liberty Wind Ensemble performed at the Colorado Music Educator Association Clinic/Conference and in 2015 performed as a feature ensemble at the Music for All National Concert Band Festival and will do so again in 2017. Mrs. Matzke was selected as the 2014 Liberty High School Teacher of the Year and the 2014 John Asbury Secondary Teacher of the Year for Academy District 20.

Mrs. Matzke resides in Colorado Springs with her husband Rex and their daughters, Jacie and Kateri.
